We are born of water and of Holy Spirit, we become one only body with Christ, we become Children of the Father in his Son Jesus Christ,

we become participative of the divine nature.

What is the great mystery that is fulfilled in Christ Jesus, through the work of the Holy Spirit. Since, if we do not become true body of Christ, we can never gain access to the Father, we will always lack the necessary thing so that we pass from death to life and from darkness we enter the most pure light of our God. If we remove Christ Jesus from the relation with God, relation that one can fulfil only in Christ through the work

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of the Holy Spirit, we remain without the Father. Since the Father is our breath of eternal life, without Him we remain without breath of true life.

Here is why the Father is the only necessary we need. But one does not give the Father but in Christ, through Christ, with Christ. But also Christ will have to be given and the one who was made proclaimer, giver, creator of Christ in our body, in our spirit, in our soul is the Apostle of the Lord. If the Apostle does not give Christ man will always lack the necessary thing he needs to live. Through the Apostle to Christ, through Christ to the Father.

LAMP UNTO MY FEET

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ot one word of the Scripture - Old and New Testament but every word, every verse, every chapter, every Book - from Genesis to the Revelation - affirm this truth: A person will reap only what he sows. Whoever sows death reaps death. Whoever sows life reaps life. Whoever sows the Gospel reaps fruit of Gospel. Whoever sows he thought of the world will reap fruit according to the thought of the world. As it is naturally impossible to sow thorns and reap the fruit of vine, so it is naturally impossible to plant vine and reap the fruit of thorns. If a person in a community sows falsity, lies, rumors, calumnies, false testimonies, murmuring, vain words, might never reap peace, true

communion, esteem, respect, bles-sing, joy and other things. He has sowed wind, he will reap storm. Whoever wants to create commu-nity where friendship, peace, communion, justice, holiness, life abounds must commit himself to act with every wisdom and intelligence in the

Holy Spirit. But also: whoever wants to create a community in which one breathes the Gospel must put all his zeal so that only the Gospel is sowed in it and it sowed according to the forms and the ways of the Gospel. If one wants to produce fruits of Christ

in this world must sow Christ. How will he sow Christ? Showing Him a live in his body, through his life. Here is why the Apostle James exhorts the faithful in Christ to always sow with docile wisdom: "Who among you is wise and understanding? Let him show his works by a good life in the humility that comes from wisdom. But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. Wisdom of this kind does not come down from above but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there is disorder and every foul practice. But the wisdom from above is first of all pure, then peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of

mercy and good fruits, without inconstancy or insincerity. And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace for those who cultivate peace." (Jm 3,13–18).

Now it is a righteous thing for every disciple of Jesus to ask: what am I sowing? Am I

sowing calumnies, falsities, lies, rumors, imaginations of my heart, thought according to the world, murmuring, brave judgements, every other vain word? Am I sowing discord, jealousies, contrapositions, wars? Am I sowing my heart handed

over to evil in the transgression of all Commandments? Or am I sowing the Gospel in the form of the Gospel, according to what my Teacher, my Saviour, my Redeemer has ordered and commanded me? One must never forget that the other - even if he has his personal and most serious responsibilities in the non-imitation of Jesus the Lord - can often be also the fruit of our sowing. How many people lead to an evil reaction for the reason of foolish and ignorant words? How many people relate in taking the distances from us because of our daily evil sowing? How much evil does being I not a true disciple of Jesus produce in the other? These are questions to which each one of us must give a response. We cannot live a life of sin and then hope to reap the fruit of edification of the Christian community. The Christian community is fruit of our evangelic life without departing from the Gospel even a dash of it. Mother of Jesus, Most Holy Woman, help us. We want to live a life of Gospel to reap fruits of Gospel.

bserving and contemplating with most pure faith, with her eyes of spirit, always enlightened and fortified by the Holy Spirit, the Christian sees the Virgin Mary seated on the throne of eternal and immortal glory, at the right hand of her Son, the King of heaven and of Earth, the Lord of the lords, the Prince of every other king, and greets Her with the sweet title of Queen: "Hail Holy Queen." The Christian knows by revelation that God the Lord has bestowed the Mother of his Son this most high title of Queen. She is Queen: of Angels, of Patriarchs, of Prophets, of Apostles, of Martyrs, of Confessors of Faith, of Virgins, of all Saints. She is Queen conceived without sin. She is Queen raised in heaven. She is Queen of the Rosary. Queen of Family. Queen of Peace. However, She is not a Queen like all the gueens of this world. She is Queen as She is Mother, Mother not only of the Son of the Most High, Christ Jesus our Lord. She is also Mother of the body of Christ that is his Church. She is Mother of every disciple of Jesus. Her mission of Mother is not limited to the sole body of Christ, it is to reach every man. IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH

Responses of Faith

How subtle and honed must the ear of the Christian be not to let himself be overwhelmed by the various falsities, heresies, mistakes of the faith he professes?

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he eye of the Christian must be honed so much in its subtleness to be able to separate the good from the evil, the fair and the unfair, the light from the darkness, the will of God from the will of man with microscopic discernment. The true and the false must be seen even in the smallest atoms. One only atom of evil and one can ruin a great good. What the book of Ecclesiastes says about the fly is worth the eye of the

Christian, incapable to see the atoms of evil and of falsity: "More weighty than wisdom or wealth is a little folly." (Eccl 10, 1) One only atom of evil, not seen by the Christian, can ruin his whole life. This is why it is necessary for him to always ask the Holy Spirit to create these eyes. David asked the Lord to create a new heart for him. The Christian must ask the Holy Spirit to create new eyes for him, eyes capable

to see even the atoms of evil, where they nest. Those of Jesus the Lord were eyes that saw the atoms of evil. He saw with the eyes of the Holy Spirit. With these eyes Jesus saw the total blindness both of the scribes and of the Pharisees, and also of his disciples still incapable to understand the divine mysteries. How great is this blindness and what fruits does it produce?

This blindness is so great to turn every mystery of our

most pure faith into falsity. It is so great to prompt to deny the thought of Christ and in his place to raise the thought of the world as unique and only thought of truth, of salvation, of redemption, of life. The first fruit is the elimination of the most pure faith in the mystery of our God, that is mystery of unity and of trinity. The second fruit is the cancellation of the faith professing that Christ is the only Redeemer, the only Saviour, the only Mediator

of eternal life, light, grace, truth, justice, peace, given to us by the Father, in the Holy Spirit, for our eternal redemption. The third fruit is the declaration of the Church no longer sacrament of Christ to bring the light of Christ and his grace in every heart. The fourth fruit is the abolition of the eternal separation between righteous and unrighteous, between those who have lived in the light and those who have lived

in darkness sealing with the death their belonging to evil, chosen by will and by will carried out. The fifth fruit is the destruction of the true anthropology according to the will of the Father in the name of an anthropology fruit of the thought of man. So far the man according to God no longer exists. The man according to man exists.
